Students need constant interaction with teacher so that pronunciation is checked and corrected in time. Hence we provide live interactive sessions.

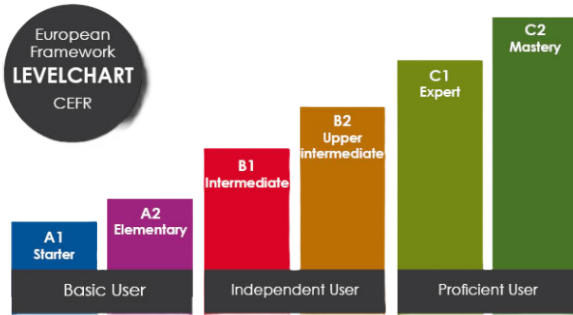

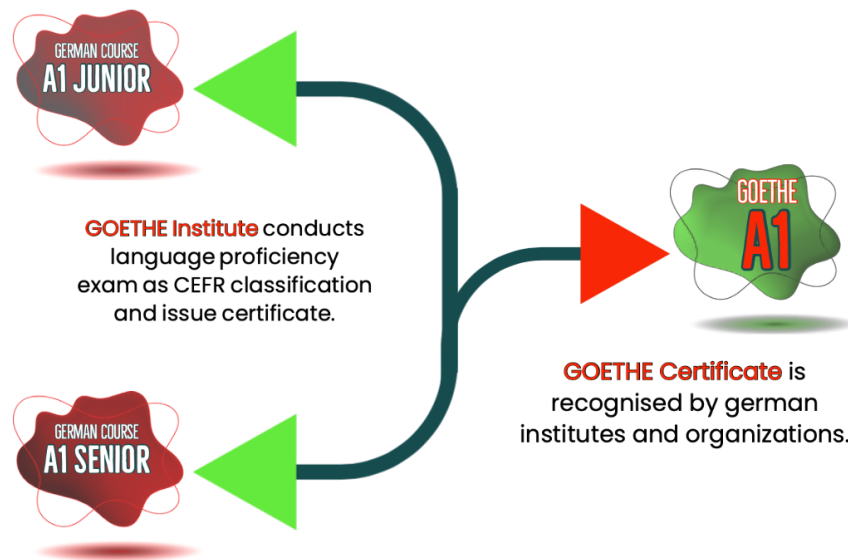

The highest level is C2, which signifies mastery of the language and the ability to use it fluently in all situations.

The CEFR can be used to measure progress in learning a new language and to set goals for future learning. It is also often used by universities and employers as a way to gauge someone's proficiency.

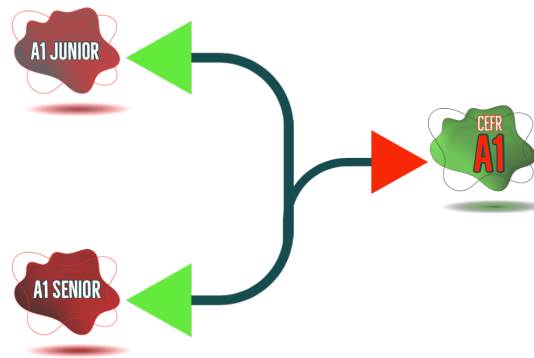
